Analyze how different parts of their digital footprint can lead others to draw conclusions—both positive and negative—about who they are.


Reflect on what they want their digital footprint to be in the future and how they can monitor and shape them.

Digital footprint


All the information online about a person posted either by that person or by others, intentionally or unintentionally

Persistent

Lasting a long time







Invisible audience

Anyone who can see information about you or posted by you online, whether you intended them to or not


